Dear Future Fourth and Fifth Graders and your parents,

Next year will be our  $17^{th}$  year participating in the Massachusetts Children's Book Award program. This reading incentive program is coordinated by Salem State University and is open to all  $4^{th} - 6^{th}$  grade students in Massachusetts.

Twenty-five titles are selected by the MCBA committee from suggestions sent in by participating teachers, librarians and students. Each year's list is made up of unique, current, high quality books which are available in paperback. Each Spring, a winning book from the list is selected from the votes of students across Massachusetts. In order to qualify to vote for the winning book, a student must read at least five titles from the list by February vacation.

Next year, we will have 6 sets of 25 books for all the classes to share. As with the past few years, that will mean that some children may have to wait for their first choice of book to read. Therefore, we are requesting that students donate purchased MCBA books to the Bancroft Library when finished reading them. MCBA books will be available for checkout at school in September.

Students may begin their MCBA reading now. I have put the list of nominated titles on the reverse side of this letter. You will find these books at Memorial Hall Library and any of the local bookstores. Some of them are even available as audio books or e-books. Try listening to or reading one or two during those long boring car rides and see how quickly the time passes!

If students read any of the books before next Fall, they have two choices for recording their reading. They may keep a written log of their reading that includes: title, date completed and a 2-3 sentence review of the book (not just "it was good or bad".) The review must include what they liked or didn't like and **why.** Or, they may use their Destiny account to write a review of the book (same rules apply.) We will review how to do this before school ends and written instructions will be emailed home. If there are any questions before school is over, please come see me in the Library or e-mail me.
