The Bancroft Play is Back!



Bancroft used to do a play every year with a traveling theater company. It was a wonderful experience for students who were new to theater or experienced in theater to have the opportunity to be in a play at Bancroft that their fellow students and families could watch. This year, we are bringing back this tradition with a local theater company, ACT Infusion, who will be directing the show.

The play will be open to students in Grades 3-5 at Bancroft and rehearsals will take place over a two-week period after school at Bancroft from **Monday, March 13 to Thursday, March 23**, culminating in two performances on **Friday, March 24** (one during school hours for Bancroft students and one evening performance for the Bancroft community).

In order to participate in the play, students must commit to attending the after school rehearsals every day for two weeks (one missed rehearsal is fine, but please don't commit if you need to miss more than one). The exact schedule is still being finalized, but we anticipate rehearsals will be 3:30-5:30pm.

Students will need to audition in order to participate, however, all students who audition will be guaranteed a role in the play. Auditions will take place on **Sunday, February 12**, at ACT Infusion/Dance Infusion (19 Lupine Rd.) from 2:00-5:00pm. Students should each sign up for a 10-minute audition slot using the button below:

SIGN UP TO AUDITION

There is a \$100 fee per student to participate in the production, which includes the auditions, rehearsals, costumes, sets, programs, etc. We are asking that this fee be paid before the audition, however, families have until the day after the audition to ask for a full refund if a student decides not to participate. After that time, we can no longer accept refunds because students will be cast in their roles in the play. Registration for auditions will be open through **Friday, February 10**.

Environmental Update: Recycle Your Textiles!



Did you know that last November, the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection added textiles and mattresses to the list of materials banned from waste disposal? In other words, it's now illegal to throw things like socks, t-shirts, sneakers, bed sheets, and stuffed animals into your household trash, even if they're ripped, stained or unusable! They don't belong in your curbside recycling either, so where can you dispose of them?

At Bancroft! Our school has a partnership with Helpsy, a textile collection company with a mission to keep clothes out of the landfills and reuse, recycle and upcycle them instead.

Look for the big blue Helpsy bin in the faculty parking lot across the street from the visitor lot/drop-off area. Simply place your clean, dry and odorless unwanted items into a closed plastic bag and drop them in the bin. Helpsy accepts clothing (including socks and underwear), footwear, accessories (hats, gloves, belts, bags, backpacks, jewelry), linens, luggage, and stuffed animals. Helpsy also has drop off bins at Sanborn Elementary, Project Home Again, and dozens of other schools and locations across the state, so spread the word!

If you're looking for other options to donate new or used goods of all types, consider <u>Project Home Again</u> (furniture, small appliances and household goods), <u>Uncommon Threads</u> (women's clothing), and <u>The Andover Thrift Shop</u> (clothing and household goods).

years. Since 1972, SpeakOUT has shared personal stories in an engaging way


and fostered dialogues within middle and high schools, colleges, businesses,

Important Reminders

Andover Public Schools require a <u>new</u> Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) check every school year for anyone who volunteers at a school or school event (i.e. field trip chaperones, volunteers for class parties, library duty, etc.). If you would like to volunteer during the 2022-2023 school year, please fill out the <u>APS CORI check form</u> and return it in person to a school administrator with an original government issued ID. Blank forms are also available at the front office. It can take 2-3 weeks for your

application to process and you will not receive a notification once it's complete. You can confirm your status with the front office.
