Bancroft Kindergarten Supply List

2024-2025

- 1 box of colored pencils
- 2 boxes of washable Crayola markers
- 1 box of 24 Crayola crayons
- 4 glue sticks
- 1 set of scissors
- 1 set of headphones (over ear, not earbuds or bluetooth please)
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 roll of paper towels
- A backpack with your child's name on it. This should be large enough to fit winter boots and other snow gear.
- A labeled, reusable snack container/bag to carry a daily snack and drink.
- A labeled, reusable lunch container/drink. (If your child will be bringing lunch to school, please be sure to package and label snacks separately from lunch.) School lunch will also be available!



How to prepare for....

Things you/your child will need...



- A big backpack. Your child will need to carry sneakers, snow gear, snacks/lunch and a folder.
- Sneakers! we will have PE during the week. Consider leaving an extra pair at school.
- A water bottle. Bringing a water bottle to school each day will help your child stay hydrated.

Things to practice with your child...



- Recognizing his/her own name
- Independently putting on/taking off a jacket and shoes
- Independently using the bathroom including shutting the door, being neat in the bathroom, and washing hands when done

Things to do this summer...



- Enjoy reading and talking about books together!
- visit the Bancroft School playground in the afternoon or evening.
- Have playdates with neighborhood or preschool friends.
- Take turns speaking and listening at dinner. Each person takes a turn telling something they did that day. Everyone else uses their whole body to listen.
- Play card or board games together. Agree on the rules before you start playing and make sure everyone plays by the rules.
- Help your child learn to work as part of a group. Build a sandcastle or lego building together. Make sure everyone gets a turn to make decisions about what to add to the building.
